### INSTRUCTIONS FOR PREPARATION OF ABSTRACTS

1. ABSTRACTS should be in ENGLISH and typed on ONE page.
2. Author(s) should themselves classify their abstract according to one of the topics given below.
  - (1) Recent Destructive Earthquakes
  - (2) Ground Motion, Seismicity, Seismic Risk and Zoning
  - (3) Response of Structures to Ground Shaking, Foundation and Soil Structure Interaction.
  - (4) Dynamics of Soils and Soil Structures, Response of Buried Structures
  - (5) Earthquake Resistant Design
  - (6) Strengthening of Earthquake Risk Structures. Repair of Earthquake Damaged Structures
  - (7) Dynamic Tests on Structures
  - (8) Earthquake Instrumentation
  - (9) Dynamic Behaviour of Structural Elements
  - (10) Architectural Aspects, Behaviour of Non-Structural Components, Mechanical and Building Services Aspects
  - (11) Earthquake Prediction, Public Policy and Earthquake Prediction
  - (12) Earthquake Engineering and Society, Economics, Acceptable Risk.

### INSTRUCTIONS FOR PREPARATION OF PAPERS

2. Use high quality white paper of 29.7cm x 21cm (A4) size. For margin leave 2cm at top and bottom, 3cm on left and 2.5cm on right.
3. Use "Elite" type - single space between lines, double space between paragraphs. Twelve characters per inch. Indent each paragraph five spaces.
4. Mathematical terms, symbols, equations and other features that cannot be typed, should be inserted into the text in black ink.
5. Tables, photographs, diagrams or other illustrations shall not be included in the text, but they shall be prepared complete with captions on a separate page (same size as indicated in 2 above) so that they could be reproduced with no reduction.
6. Each term of a nomenclature or glossary shall be treated as a paragraph, double spaced from the preceding term, and indented five spaces on the left.
7. Footnotes shall be affixed on the bottom of the page where referenced by a number superscript enclosed by parentheses in the text. Use Roman numbers for footnotes; Arabic numbers for references to the bibliography.
8. Manuscript shall be arranged in the following order:
  - i. Title and author's name. Provide a footnote and affiliations of the authors;
  - ii. A 100 word (maximum) synopsis of the paper;
  - iii. Glossary of terms, if required;
  - iv. Body of the manuscript;
  - v. Bibliography;
  - vi. Tables;
  - vii. Figures, photographs, diagrams, etc.
