ARRANGEMENTS FOR 12WCEE IN NEW ZEALAND

1. Background

The World Conference on Earthquake Engineering (WCEE) is held every four years in a host country on behalf of the International Association for Earthquake Engineering (IAEE).

The aim of IAEE is "to promote international co-operation and to interchange knowledge, ideas and the results of research and practical experiences among scientists and engineers in the field of earthquake engineering".

For 11WCEE in Acapulco:

- (i) Number of technical registrants was about 1,550.
- (ii) The technical programme consisted of:
 - 2 keynote addresses
 - 10 seminars
 - 15 state-of-the-art lectures
 - 23 special theme sessions
 - plus
 - 1,265 other papers of which
 - 156 (12%) were oral presentations, and
 - 1,109 (88%) were poster presentations
- (iii) At times there were up to eight concurrent sessions of oral presentations
At 11WCEE in Acapulco presentations were made by the National Delegates of the two countries (New Zealand and Indonesia) seeking to host 12WCEE. The presentations were heard by the National Delegates of the other countries. New Zealand was selected with the venue to be in the city of Auckland.

2. 12WCEE Arrangements to Date

2.1 12WCEE Organising Committee

A Steering Committee for 12WCEE was set up in New Zealand in late 1996. That Committee is now referred to as the Organising Committee and has now held a total of nine meetings.

The adjacent Carlton hotel also has rooms which could be used if necessary.

2.7 Non-Technical Management of 12WCEE

Convention Management Services Ltd, a company which is

expert in the management of large conferences, has been employed by the Management Committee of the NZNSEE and the Organising Committee to arrange the non-technical details of 12WCEE, such as printing and distribution, registration, AV equipment and the many other tasks required to make the conference a well-run event.

2.8 Other Decisions Made by the Organising Committee to Date

2.8.1 Finance

The Organising Committee has prepared a detailed draft budget (16 pages) for 12WCEE which lists all items of income and expenditure. At this stage it appears from our budget that the registration fee for 12WCEE is likely to be not more than \$700 US.

The Board of the Earthquake Commission (EQC) has provided cashflow support with a ceiling of \$150,000 to assist with the costs of organising 12WCEE, to be repaid to

EQC after the conference.

Very accountable procedures for handling the finances have been adopted.

2.8.2 Sponsorship and Exhibition

The Board of the Earthquake Commission (EQC) has been extremely helpful in granting \$75,000 as Principal Sponsor.

Sponsorship in addition to that from EQC is being sought.

Exhibition space for displays will be available at a set cost.

Donations from developed countries will be sought by the President of the International Association of Earthquake Engineering to allow expenses for some delegates from developing countries to be met.

2.8.3 Local Arrangements

Beds have been pre-booked in a range of hotels and other accommodation with room rates varying from expensive to modest.

2.8.4 Publications - Brochures and Proceedings

The 2nd Announcement and call for Abstracts and suggestions for Theme Sessions will be mailed in May 1998.

The Proceedings of the Conference on CD Rom will be issued to all registrants. Hard copies of the Proceedings will also be available at extra cost to registrants if pre-ordered.

Subcommittees

The Technical Programme Committee (TPC) will have three subcommittees.

1 Review Subcommittee

Tasks:

- Arrange for reviews of abstracts in the topic areas and suggestions for special theme sessions.
- Assess reviewers comments.
- Recommend to TPC whether the abstracts should be accepted for a theme session or a poster session or declined. About 10% of abstracts will be accepted for oral presentation and those papers grouped into theme sessions on particular topics suggested by the Review Subcommittee. International experts will also be invited to assist with arrangements for some theme sessions.

- Earthquake Engineering in Developing Countries
- Earthquake Engineering in Practice
- International Issues in Earthquake Engineering
- Engineering Seismology
- Geotechnical Engineering
- Structural Engineering
- Lifeline Systems
- Design Criteria and Methods
- Social and Economic Issues
- Lessons from Recent Earthquakes
- Other Issues

As a result of their suggestions, individuals or groups may also be invited to arrange special theme sessions and possible authors.

2. Poster Presentation Subcommittee

Tasks:

- Arrange the poster sessions by grouping the accepted papers for posters appropriately over the five days.
- Deciding where they should be placed and documenting their positions.

3. Debate Subcommittee

Task:

- Organise the debate on a controversial topic to be held on the Wednesday evening of 12WCEE.
