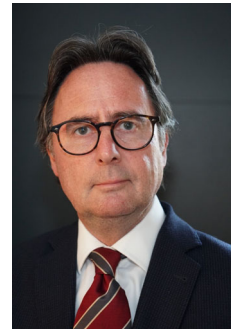

From the President

Welcome to another Newsletter and my last as President of the Society.

It is hugely disappointing that our 2020 annual conference has had to be cancelled. I wish to acknowledge and thank conference convenors Geoff Rodgers and Rajesh Dhakal (and others) who put a huge effort in to organising the conference, and more recently arranging the cancellation. I commiserate with them not being able to enjoy the conference they worked so hard to make happen.



However, we have salvaged what we can. We will publish as many of the submitted papers as possible - thank you to the authors. And we are planning a series of seismic webinars to be held, hopefully monthly, over the rest of this year.

On the financial front there is a significant loss from the conference. Refunds have been offered to registrants, exhibitors and sponsors. I would like to thank those individuals and organisations who kindly left money in to help offset our financial loss.

NZSEE is planning a new project aiming to rethink New Zealand's seismic design standards to achieve more resilient performance outcomes. Thanks to Helen Ferner for leading this initiative.

It is pleasing that MBIE is currently funding the update to the National Seismic Hazard Model. And it has formed a new Seismic Risk Working Group, we understand to consider possible new technical approaches to representing seismic risk in the building system. It is disappointing though that MBIE has not directly invited NZSEE participation in that group.

EQC and NZSEE share objectives for promoting earthquake research and increased awareness about seismic resilience. I recently signed a renewed Memorandum of Understanding with EQC for our partnership with them. EQC provides NZSEE with essential financial support for the cost of publishing the Bulletin, sponsorship of the jointly managed Ivan Skinner award, and sponsorship for our annual conference. I would like to sincerely thank EQC for their continued support of the Society.

New Zealand communities are now certainly testing their understanding of "resilience" – how to recover quickly from a health and economic shock. While the immediate focus may have moved, let's hope we don't also have to test our seismic resilience during our journey through Covid-19.

During the lock-down the Government's Crown Infrastructure Partnership has been busy looking for "shovel-ready" infrastructure projects. What better time to accelerate the earthquake-prone buildings legislated programme? I hope the Government will take a lead to incentivise investment in reducing seismic risk to protect the lives of New Zealanders. The recent mandatory securing of parapets and facades in Wellington following the Kaikoura Earthquake was a successful example of making rapid seismic safety improvements.

Earthquake activity has thankfully been a little benign over the two years of my tenure as President. But we have been continuing the conversation to prepare New Zealand for its next major seismic event, in particular the expected event that will have Wellington's name on it.

I now sign off as President. It's been a privilege and a pleasure to serve the Society and I would like to offer my sincere thanks to the Management Committee, Executive Officer and everyone who has supported me in this role. I wish you all well. The next President of the Society will be elected by the new Management Committee following the forthcoming AGM.

NZSEE 2020 Webinar Series

While we find ourselves in challenging circumstances, we are excited about the opportunity to make the most of this unique situation, stay engaged with all our members, and to deliver a successful webinar series. We look forward to you joining us online!
